Leaving part of your estate as a gift

RH16 1NY all/ fraction / percentage share (of the residue) of my estate, to be used for its general charitable purposes, and I direct that the receipt of the Chief Executive or duly authorised officer shall be a valid and appropriate form of discharge.”

Leaving a particular sum as a gift

“I give to ICE Benevolent Fund (Registered Charity No. 1126595) of 5 Mill Hill Close, Haywards Heath, West Sussex. RH16 1NY, the sum of £ amount to be used for its general charitable purposes and I direct that the receipt of the Chief Executive or duly authorised officer shall be a valid and appropriate form of discharge.”
